SNMWTL Captain's Responsibilities

Following are YOUR responsibilities as a Captain in the SNMWTL. You are expected to perform the following or pass this responsibility to your Co-Captain or a teammate in your absence. Please be familiar with these expectations and make sure your team members understand them as well.

- 1. Remember, this is a game we all play for FUN! Be flexible whenever you can. The Rules are to assist you in having a fair and enjoyable match.
- 2. If you, as Captain, are unavailable for a match, you must contact the Captain of the opposing team and let her know your Acting Captain's name and phone number.
- 3. Know the rules regarding rainout rescheduling. Post this date on the website AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.
- 4. If you have any defaults, please contact the opposing Captain ASAP so she can inform her players.
- 5. When doubling up players, please inform the opposing Captain as soon as you are aware you are doubling back. This MUST be done PRIOR to the exchange of line-ups.
- 6. When contacting another Captain to request any changes to the line up, make sure you get a response back confirming the change. Leaving a phone message or email is not sufficient. If you have had no response from the Captain, contact the Co Captain.
- 7. Remember to inform your singles player that if either singles player is doubling up, a Match Tie Breaker must be played in lieu of a full third set.
- 8. When pulling up players from a lower division, every effort should be made to play them in the lower positions in your line up.
- 9. Complete your line up prior to arriving at the match. Use the Score Sheet provided by the League. There is a fill in score sheet where player names can be typed in. However, if you choose to write in the names please write neatly so all names can be read.
- 10. Post the match results on the website WITHIN 72 hours of the match. A one-point penalty will be imposed against both teams for late score reporting.
- 11. Make sure you have copies of the league rules and USTA Friend at Court at every match.
- 12. When hosting, provide sufficient food and beverages for all players for the duration of the match. Water is essential and should be available on each court.
- 13. Please be accommodating regarding traffic problems that occur during travel to matches.
- 14. Enforce the starting and default times. Be sure your players know these times and encourage them to arrive early.
- 15. If you have a problem, please try to resolve it with the other captain. If that fails, consult your Club Rep for advice. The last course of action should be to complete a grievance form and submit it to the board for resolution.
